Short Title: Maintenance of State Veterans Cemeteries. (Public)

Sponsors: Representative Wheatley.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AND MILITARY AFFAIRS
3 TO ENHANCE OVERALL MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE'S VETERANS
4 CEMETERIES.
5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6 **SECTION 1.(a)** The Department of Veterans and Military Affairs (hereafter
7 "Department") shall ensure that all four of the State's veterans cemeteries are staffed by
8 employees who are able to operate and maintain the cemeteries in a manner that honors the State's
9 veterans and their families. The Department shall identify and correct any issues at the State's
10 veterans cemeteries related to (i) undue delays in installing headstones, (ii) damage to headstones,
11 temporary markers, and graves caused by lawn equipment or vehicles, (iii) drainage and flooding
12 problems, (iv) scattered debris and other items, and (v) overall grounds appearance, including
13 bare patches due to lack of grass. In its efforts to comply with this section, the Department shall
14 permit auxiliary and active military groups and other fraternal organizations, including the
15 Veterans of Foreign Wars, the North Carolina National Guard, and the ROTC, to volunteer to
16 perform maintenance projects at the State's veterans cemeteries.
17 **SECTION 1.(b)** In order to better serve the families of our State's veterans, the
18 Department shall adjust its policies to accommodate family requests relating to funeral services.
19 The Department shall review its current policies and the reasons for those policies on the
20 following: (i) chapel only services, (ii) the time allotted for funeral services, (iii) the number of
21 attendees allowed to attend funeral services, and (iv) no visitation of grave sites while a funeral
22 is being held.
23 **SECTION 2.** By October 1, 2025, the Department shall submit a report of its findings
24 on (i) the issues set out in subsection (a) of Section 1 of this act and any changes made to address
25 those issues and (ii) any changes made to the policies listed in subsection (b) of Section 1 of this
26 act to the House and Senate Chairs of the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General
27 Government.
28 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.

Short Title: Adopt State Veterans Museum. (Public)

Sponsors: Representative Clampitt.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT ADOPTING THE VETERANS HISTORY MUSEUM OF THE CAROLINAS AS
3 THE STATE'S VETERANS HISTORY MUSEUM.
4 Whereas, the Veterans History Museum of the Carolinas opened in the Town of
5 Brevard in 2016; and
6 Whereas, the mission of the Museum is "to honor our nation's veterans, to educate the
7 public about our country's military history and the contribution of our service men and women,
8 and to preserve important and unique historic artifacts"; and
9 Whereas, the Museum honors veterans of all branches of the military but especially
10 those of the Carolinas and the north Georgia region by displaying artifacts from the 20th century
11 to the present; and
12 Whereas, the Museum has a large collection of unique military artifacts, uniforms,
13 weaponry, original newspapers, personal letters, and other one-of-a-kind items, such as a WWI
14 six-person Maxim machine gun, a 1943 Willys Jeep and 1942 Harley-Davidson motorcycle used
15 in WWII-Europe, and exhibits honoring women in the military and the United States Merchant
16 Marine; and
17 Whereas, the Museum serves as a gathering place for veterans to meet informally,
18 share stories, and make new friends. Monthly programs include "Veterans Coffee &
19 Conversation," which provides a welcoming and private space for combat and noncombat
20 veterans to talk and listen; and
21 Whereas, the Museum has six professionally produced, copyrighted videos, "Through
22 Their Eyes," to teach the history of each American war since WWI, using local veterans' stories;
23 and
24 Whereas, the Museum is free to the public and is staffed by volunteers; and
25 Whereas, the State does not have an official veterans history museum; Now, therefore,
26 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
27 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
28 section to read:
29 **"§ 145-52. State veterans history museum.**
30 **The Veterans History Museum of the Carolinas, located in Transylvania County, is adopted**
31 **as the official Veterans History Museum of the State of North Carolina."**
32 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
